

JAAS e-documents

The editorial board of Journal of Assyrian Academic Studies (JAAS) has taken the initiative to make the Syriac and English contents of its publication, Journal of Assyrian Academic Studies, available on-line on the World Wide Web at <http://www.jaas.org> (electronic documents or e-documents). The contents are in Adobe's Acrobat Portable Format (PDF) and are available for on-line viewing provided that you have Adobe's Acrobat reader which can be downloaded for free from Adobe's web site (instructions are given on JAAS web site). The Adobe's PDF is the most widely and portable format used for electronic publishing second only, perhaps, to Hyper Text Markup Language (HTML) used for publishing web pages. With this capability, visitors will be able to read the contents on-line, download, and print them. The printed contents with their formats are preserved in their electronic version.

At this time, only the contents of volume 10, number 1 through volume 14, no 1 are posted on the web site. This attempt is to encourage visitors to preview the journal contents and hopefully tempt them to become regular subscribers. The editorial board's plan is to make all future JAAS contents and most of the previous issues available on World Wide Web in electronic and downloadable format. At this time we have granted public access to the contents. This means that every visitor can view and download contents with out any restrictions. However, at a future date, access to on-line contents will be restricted to JAAS paid subscribers only. Non-subscribers will be able to obtain individual articles

at a nominal charge. We will also make these e-documents available to the authors who submitted materials and are published in the Journal.

The editorial board of JAAS has also provided a local search facility for quick access to Author/Article indexes. With this facility, you will be able to search all published articles by author or by article name quickly. Additional exciting services are also planned in the near future.
