

A New Book

Studies in Neo-Aramaic

This is a scholarly collection of works (1990) on different dialects of modern Aramaic including the eastern dialects (Assyrian/Chaldean) and the western dialects, as well as the Jewish Neo-Aramaic dialects.

Studies in Neo-Aramaic (SNA) is published in the Harvard Semitic studies and the editor is professor Wolfhart Heinrichs of Harvard University. It is worth mentioning that SNA is printed with the support of David B. Perley Assyrian Memorial Fund.

SNA is in six parts:

- I) **An Annotated Bibliography**, by Georg Krotkoff.
- II) **Phonetic and Phonology**, with contributions by Edward Odisho and Konstantin Tsereteli.
- III) **Morphology and Lexicology**, with contributions by Solomon Sara and Yona Sabar.
- IV) **Comparative Studies**, with contributions by Samuel Fox, Robert Hoberman and Otto Jastrow.
- V) **New Fieldwork**, with contributions by Estiphan Panoussi, Werner Arnold and Gideon Goldenberg.
- VI) **Philological and Literary Studies**, with contributions by Bruno Poizat, Wolfhart Heinrichs and Yusuf Ishaq.
